DEVOTIONAL MESSAGE

Gifts of the Holy Spirit ... by Billy

READ: 1 CORINTHIANS 12:1-7

- Spiritual gifts are always spoken about in the context of the church as a body in which each member fulfils an appointed and unique role. (Note the context in Romans 12:4-5 and Eph.4:1-6).
- There are 5 different Greek words to describe the gifts of the Spirit and I will make mention of these as I proceed.
 - V1: The first of these words is PNEUMATIKAI. The use of this word indicates that the origin of the gift is the Holy Spirit.
 - V4: The second word that describes the spiritual gifts is the Greek word CHARISMA. This indicates that the gift is neither earned or deserved- it is a gift of God's grace.
 - ⋄ V5 : The word DIAKONIA in verse 5 indicates that each gift is meant to serve the members of the body.
 - ♥ V6: The 4th word used to describe the spiritual gifts is the Greek word ENERGEMA. This indicates that the exceeding greatness of God's power is in operation when His gifts are active in the life of the church.
 - **V7**: The last description of the spiritual gifts relates to the word PHANEROSIS. This indicates the manifestation element of each gift.
- The word is also associated with making something visible. In other words, when there is a manifestation of the Spirit for the common good, all confusion should be dispelled and a sense that God is in the midst ought to pervade the atmosphere. (1 Cor.14:25) Let me summarize with an application of this teaching.
- We have heard about the anointing of the Holy Spirit that is upon each believer. It is the anointing of God which enables us to receive His designated gifts in our lives. The gifts of the Holy Spirit come from God out of His grace and mercy.
- This is confirmed when they are ministered in humble service to the church and when they reveal both the truth of God's word and the power of His activity.
