Gift of Leadership ... By Billy

- 44 6 f God has given you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously."(NLT).
- "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood." (Acts 20:28)
- It is an awesome privilege to be in a position of leadership but with that position come a great responsibility to be a good example to others.
- Those in leadership are to contend earnestly for the faith (Jude 3) and this degree of earnestness should be found among all believers (Heb.6:11-12).
- Leadership roles are not confined to pastoral duties but can also include youth leaders, worship leaders, cell group leaders as well as a host of leadership roles outside of the church ministry.
- One only has to consider the life of Deborah who judged Israel to find leadership qualities that are included in this gifting.
- As a prophetess she was a woman of discernment (Judges 4:5) who lived close to God and heard His voice so that she found the courage to obey His commands (4:6-7).
- Deborah spoke in a way that influenced the nation for good (4:14) and this led to a strengthening of those who followed her example. (4:24).
- She also possessed an unwavering commitment to do God's will. She was willing to do whatever was necessary to encourage others to become active. (4:8-9). The 4th gift to consider is the gift of mercy.
- There is an interesting distinction between the gift of encouragement and the gift of mercy. The former gift helps with words of loving comfort whereas the latter helps with deeds of loving comfort.
- Many of us may have the feeling of sympathy for those in distress but mercy is only shown when some deed of kindness is done.
- The good Samaritan was motivated by mercy and not by cultural norms or selfinterest and he was willing to go the second mile to help someone in distress.
